

Information for Authors

The **Journal of the Brazilian Institute of Human Rights** publishes academic articles related to the area of human rights, prioritizing original and unpublished contributions.

Authors must follow the guidelines below for submission of manuscripts, observing the ABNT norms and the ethical standards of scientific publication.

The journal accepts submissions in the following categories:

- **Scientific articles** (original research result);
- **Theoretical essays**;
- **Critical reviews** of recent works;
- **Reports of experiences or practices** aimed at the promotion of human rights.

Texts in **Portuguese, Spanish and English** are accepted. All articles must contain title, abstract and keywords in all **three languages**.

The texts must comply with ABNT standards and the following guidelines:

- **Paper size:** A4;
- **Margins:** top and left 3 cm; bottom and right 2 cm;
- **Font:** Times New Roman, size 12;
- **Spacing:** 1.5 between lines;
- **Alignment:** justified;
- **Paragraph:** 1.25 cm indentation in the first line;
- **Pages:** Numbered in the upper right corner.
- **Scientific articles:** between **15 and 25 pages** (including references and annexes);
- **Essays:** up to **15 pages**;
- **Reviews:** up to **6 pages**.

The manuscript must contain:

- **Title** (in Portuguese, English and Spanish);
- **Abstract** (up to 250 words) and **keywords** (from 3 to 5 terms);
- **Abstract and Keywords**;
- **Resumen and Palabras clave**;
- **Introduction**;
- **Development** (numbered sections and subsections according to NBR 6024);
- **Final considerations**;
- **References** (according to ABNT NBR 6023: 2018).
- **Short direct quotes:** up to 3 lines, between double quotes;
- **Long direct quotes:** more than 3 lines, 4 cm indentation, font size 10, no quotation marks;
- **Indirect citations:** they must indicate author, year and page when necessary.

Example: (BOBBIO, 1992, p. 45).

References must follow **ABNT NBR**. Examples:

- **Book:**

- **Journal article:**
PIOVESAN, F. The inter-American system for the protection of human rights. *Brazilian Journal of Human Rights*, v. 15, n. 2, p. 45-67, 2020.

Ethics and originality

- Submitted papers must be **unpublished** and **not be under simultaneous evaluation** in another journal.
- In cases of **co-authorship**, all authors must have contributed significantly to the research and writing.
- Practices of **plagiarism, self-plagiarism or manipulation of data** will imply immediate rejection and communication to the institutions involved.
- The journal adopts **software similarity verification before** evaluation.

The published texts remain under the **ownership of the authors**, but the journal holds the right of **first publication**.

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The Journal has a Scientific-Editorial Board composed of experts of notorious knowledge in the field of Human Rights who act, predominantly, as a body of reviewers of the publication. However, ad hoc reviewers may be invited when necessary.

The selection process of the submitted articles involves the evaluation of two members of the aforementioned Council. In case of divergence between the reviews, the manuscript is sent to a third evaluator.
